viii. In addition to this, separate instructions are given with each section and question, wherever necessary.

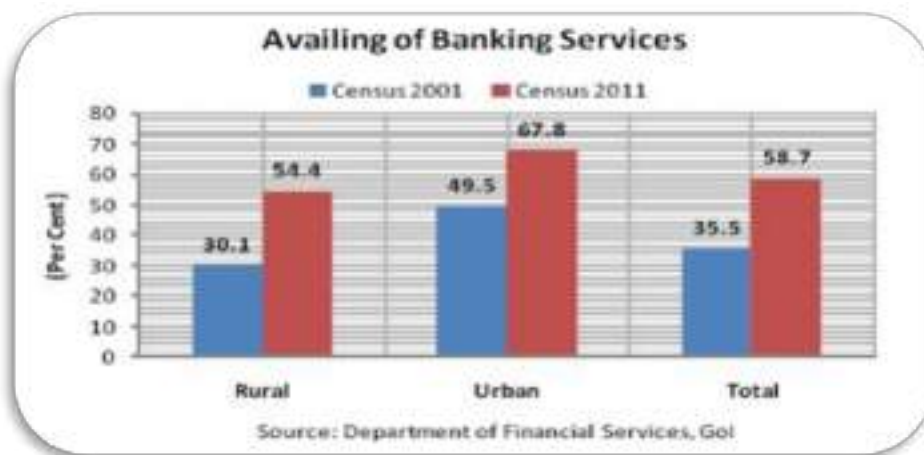


