


(XX) [0.5]</p> <p>But men have a mismatched pair of sex chromosomes in which one is normal sized – X chromosome while the other is a short one called Y chromosome. Putting the values in the equation we get -

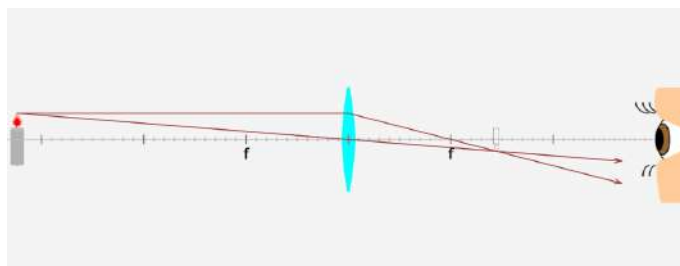
$$\frac{1}{5} = \frac{1}{7} - \frac{1}{u}$$

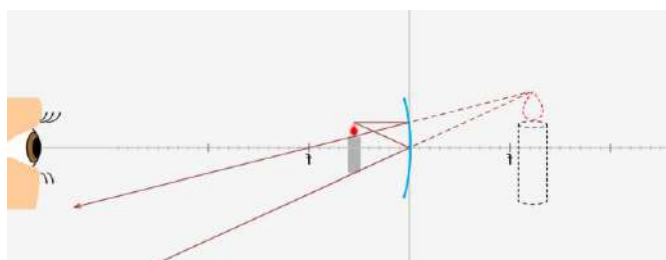
